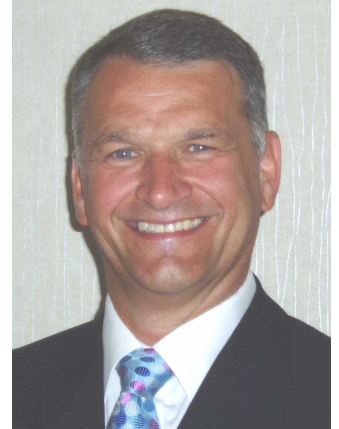

Poor pavement condition update

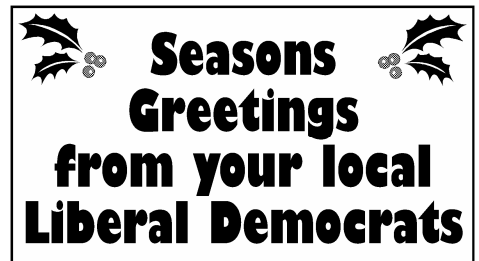


You will recall from the last edition of FOCUS that Murray raised residents' concerns about the condition of the pavement in Fingask Street (see left) which is in very poor condition and is not yet adopted by the Council. The FOCUS Team has now received a response from Dundee City Council about this and was advised that Fingask Street hadn't yet been included on the list of streets whose footpaths are being considered for future adoption. However, the good news is that it is to be considered for inclusion on the list when it is reviewed early next year.

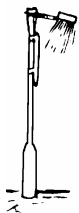
Murray has also received similar concerns from residents about other local pavements, including parts of Kinghorne Road, Law Street, Drummond Street and Lawside Avenue. The FOCUS Team has reported all of the footpaths raised to the City Council's Planning & Transportation Department.

Other local issues :

- **71 BUS SERVICE** : Residents have asked Murray if the service times of the 71 service could be extended. The FOCUS Team has written to Stagecoach (Strathtay) about this.
- **RECYCLING** : A number of residents have contacted Murray to say they do not, as yet, have blue recycling bins. The FOCUS Team has taken this matter up with the City Council's Waste Management Department.
- **WHITE LINES** : You'll recall in the last Edition of FOCUS, Murray raised concerns about very worn white junction lines in Bruce Street at its junction with Kinghorne Road. We are pleased to say that, following our contacting the City Council, the FOCUS Team has been advised that the Area Supervisor will arrange for an Order to be placed to renew the Give Way lines here.
